**Mahjongg meets at the Centre on Mondays at 10 in Jessie's Room** This is NOT the computer tile matching game - it is a Chinese tile game from the mid - 1800s. There are over 40 variants, and the one we play is known as American Mahjongg - a version developed on a US Military base in 1937.

The American version uses 8 jokers, as well as a playing card with acceptable patterns that change annually. We also use display racks and pusher bars to manage the tiles. The game is very popular in the States, and you can even take cruises and play Mahjongg at Sea. We hear that there are professional players out there, but here at the Centre we don't play for money.

We have taught many people how to play through Elder College and would like to invite everyone to come and watch, or come and play. Most of us have sets to use, so just bring your curiosity and enthusiasm !
